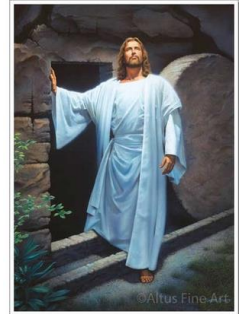

Under New Business, Steve moved to transfer \$5000 from our Memorial Fund to our General Fund to add a cushion to our current account balance. It was seconded by Bob.

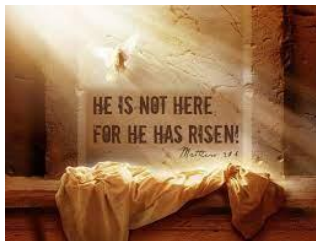

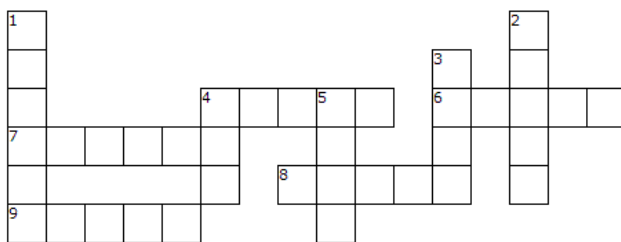
