#### FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

To members of Calvary Lutheran Church,

Our pulpit supply consisted of Pastor Darrell Morton, Pastor Ruth Hetland, and laypersons. Pastor Morton was with us once or twice a month from January through April. Dear Friends in Christ,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for sponsoring the lay school for ministry classes that I have had the opportunity to be a part of since October. The lay school for ministry is a part of Luther Seminary through a learning platform called Faith + Lead. Fortunately, these classes are completely online and can be done whenever they work into my schedule, so I'm able to take these classes at my own speed. Each month there is a different topic and about 2-4 hours of video lectures to watch as well as a monthly zoom class that we can participate in or watch the recording at a better time. So far, some of the topics have touched on the basics of sermon writing, how to understand the text, what the digital age means for our congregations, the benefits and drawbacks to online religious communities, rural ministry trends, how to preach at funerals, and small congregations that are experiencing growth. These classes have taught me how to better understand the Bible readings, which has been helpful in sermon writing. These classes have also opened my eyes to some trends in small and rural congregations. The zoom meetings have allowed me to hear from others who are active in similarly sized congregations throughout the United States. Again, thank you all for this opportunity to learn in this new and exciting way, and thank you for the opportunity to join with you in worship.




