SERVICE UPDATES

Greetings,

I want to inform you even though Pastor Ruth is no longer with us, we will have communion every month. I visited with Bishop Bill Tesh, of the NW Synod, on Wednesday, September 11, 2024. Explaining to him, Pastor Ruth's inability to do Sunday services for us and the need for communion. He has authorized Jenny Lien to administer communion. This means we will not have a designated Sunday for communion. Jenny's schedule changes monthly, therefore, our communion Sunday will be a Sunday she can be with us. We will try to have it listed in the newsletter, but sometimes that information may not be available before it is printed. It will be noted in our weekly bulletins.

Jenny has been taking the Faith+Lead classes since last October. In our February newsletter, she explained what this entails. She stated that Faith+Lead is a lay school for ministry classes. It is an online platform that can be done whenever it works into her schedule and at her speed. Each month there is a different topic, 2-4 hours of video lectures, and a monthly Zoom class to participate in or watch the recording when it is convenient for her. Some of the coursework topics include the basics of sermon writing, how to understand the text, rural ministry trends, and how to preach at funerals. The Zoom meetings allow her to interact with classmates from similarly sized congregations throughout the United States.

We are very thankful for Jenny. Not only does she serve us as a layperson, but she also is the organist, and pianist and sings along with us.

I also want to thank the other laypeople who have been so willing to step up and conduct services for us. If we did not have these wonderful people, we would not be able to have church services. They are Joyce White, Nathan Johnson, and Jeanne Rains.


